RIICOM201E Communicate in the Workplace	<ul> <li>In completing this unit, the students will gain skills and knowledge required to successfully:</li> <li>Plan and prepare for workplace communication using equipment and systems,</li> <li>Communicate using communication equipment and systems,</li> <li>Carry out face-to-face routine communication, and</li> <li>Complete written documentation.</li> </ul>
RIIRIS301E Apply RISK MANAGEMENT PROCESSES	<ul> <li>This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to apply risk management processes in the mining, drilling and civil infrastructure industry. This unit applies to those who carry out or assist in carrying out risk assessment in the workplace. In completing this unit, students will learn how to successfully:</li> <li>Plan and prepare for risk management,</li> <li>Identify and assess unacceptable risk,</li> <li>Identify and recommend risk controls,</li> <li>Contribute to the implementation of risk controls, and</li> <li>Review risk management documentation.</li> </ul>
RIIWHS201E WORK SAFELY AND FOLLOW WHS POLICIES AND PROCEDURES	<ul> <li>This unit describes a participant's skills and knowledge required to work safely and follow WHS policies and procedures in the Resources and Infrastructure Industries. In completing this unit, students will learn how to successfully:</li> <li>Access and apply site safety procedures,</li> <li>Apply personal safety measures,</li> <li>Apply operational safety measures,</li> <li>Maintain personal wellbeing, and</li> <li>Identify and report incidents.</li> </ul>
RIIERR301E RESPOND TO WORK SITE INCIDENTS	<ul> <li>This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to respond to work site incidents and establish forward control points in the resources and infrastructure industries. In completing this unit, students will learn how to successfully:</li> <li>Plan and prepare for incident response,</li> <li>Respond to incident, and</li> <li>Prepare forward control point.</li> </ul>

GROUP A	
PUASAR022* Participate in a rescue operation	<ul> <li>This unit of competency involves the skills and knowledge required to participate in rescue operations as a member of a rescue team; it underpins specialist rescue operations. This includes a wide range of rescue and environmental situations which may incorporate industrial, rural, bush and extreme environmental conditions. In completing this unit, students will learn how to successfully:</li> <li>Prepare and respond to rescue,</li> <li>Contribute to a risk assessment at the scene,</li> <li>Perform rescue, and</li> <li>Conclude rescue operations.</li> <li>*Pre-requisite units: students must hold current competency in HLTAID011 Provide first aid prior to completing this unit (only applicable to individuals within the fire sector).</li> </ul>

RIIERR302E RESPOND TO LOCAL EMERGENCIES AND INCIDENTS	<ul> <li>This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to respond to a range of local emergencies and incidents. It includes implementing response plans, monitoring the situation, taking necessary precautionary measures, and supporting formal relief. In completing this unit, students will learn how to successfully:</li> <li>Prepare to respond to local emergency or incident</li> <li>Respond to local emergency or incident</li> <li>Support formal relief and debrief</li> </ul>	
PUAFIR210 <b>PREVENT INJURY</b>	<ul> <li>This unit involves the skills and knowledge required to identify and avoid workplace hazards and risks, to maintain personal safety and to report identified issues to supervisors and team members.</li> <li>It is designed as an introduction to safe work practices and is specifically relevant to a workplace requiring personnel to be involved in incidents, prescribed burns and/or operational aspects of emergency management. In completing this unit, students will learn how to successfully:</li> <li>Identify workplace hazards and risks, and advise others</li> <li>Implement hazard and risk control procedures</li> <li>Monitor effectiveness of hazard and risk control procedures.</li> </ul>	
PUAFIR207* OPERATE BREATHING APPARATUS OPEN CIRCUIT	<ul> <li>This unit of competency involves the skills and knowledge required to select, don, operate and maintain breathing apparatus equipment in a hazardous atmosphere. In completing this unit, students will learn how to successfully:</li> <li>Conduct pre-donning checks and tests on breathing apparatus,</li> <li>Don and check breathing apparatus,</li> <li>Operate breathing apparatus, and</li> <li>Conclude operations.</li> <li>*Pre-requisite units: students must hold current competency in PUAFIR210 Prevent injury prior to completing this unit (only applicable to individuals within the fire sector).</li> </ul>	
PUAFIR324* Render Hazardous Materials incidents safe	<ul> <li>This unit of competency involves the skills and knowledge required to safely combat incidents involving hazardous materials. In completing this unit, the students will gain skills and knowledge required to successfully:</li> <li>Recognise hazardous materials incidents</li> <li>Identify and assess hazards</li> <li>Assist with development of plan for mitigation of HAZMAT incident</li> <li>Assist with implementation of plan for mitigation of a HAZMAT incident</li> <li>Assist with review of plan.</li> <li>*Pre-requisite units: students must hold current competency in PUAFIR207 Operate breathing apparatus open circuit prior to completing this unit (only applicable to individuals within the fire sector).</li> </ul>	
PUAFIR306* IDENTIFY, DETECT AND MONITOR HAZARDOUS MATERIALS AT AN INCIDENT	<ul> <li>This unit of competency involves the skills and knowledge required to use specific equipment to detect airborne contaminants, liquids and solids at a hazardous materials incident. In completing this unit, the students will gain skills and knowledge required to successfully:</li> <li>Assess hazardous materials incident,</li> <li>Identify and assess hazards at incident,</li> <li>Develop an entry plan,</li> <li>Implement entry plan, and</li> <li>Review entry plan.</li> <li>* Pre-requisite units: students must hold current competency in PUAFIR207 Operate breathing apparatus open circuit (only applicable to individuals within the fire sector).</li> </ul>	



RIIERR201E Conduct fire team Operations	<ul> <li>This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to conduct fire team operations, including fighting and containing fires. In completing this unit, the students will gain skills and knowledge required to successfully:</li> <li>Prepare for fire team operations</li> <li>Fight or contain fire</li> <li>Strategies to minimise fire recurrence</li> <li>Report and debrief</li> <li>Audit firefighting installations.</li> </ul>
GROUP C	
PMAWHS211 Prepare Equipment for Emergency response	<ul> <li>This unit of competency covers the skills and knowledge required to undertake minor maintenance and other preparation of equipment for use in emergency situations. This unit of competency applies to operators who are required to apply procedures to inspect and assemble equipment, undertake minor servicing, ensure equipment is ready and available for use, identify problems and take action. In completing this unit, the students will gain skills and knowledge required to successfully:</li> <li>Identify emergency equipment,</li> <li>Inspect and assemble emergency equipment in accordance with procedures, and</li> <li>Report and record equipment status.</li> </ul>
