COURSE OVERVIEW

These units cover the skills and knowledge required to use specialised equipment in the provision of cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) in line with the Australian Resuscitation Council (ARC) Guidelines and provide advanced first aid response to a casualty. These units apply to all workers who may be required to provide a first aid response in a range of complex situations, including community and workplace settings.



COURSE CONTENT

Responding to emergency situation

- Recognise an emergency situation
- Identify, assess and minimise immediate hazards to health and safety of self and others
- Assess the casualty and recognise the need for first aid
- Assess the situation and seek assistance from emergency response services

Apply appropriate first aid procedures

- Perform CPR & provide supplemental oxygen
- Provide first aid in accordance with established first aid principles
- Display respectful behaviour & obtain consent from casualty
- Ensure comfort of casualty using available resources
- Operate first aid equipment
- Monitor the casualty's condition and respond in accordance with first aid principles

Coordinate first aid activities until arrival of medical assistance

- Identify available resources required and establish communication links with appropriate third parties
- Deploy required resources to appropriate locations
- Document the provision of resources and recommend modifications as required
- Coordinate evacuation of casualties

Communicate details of the incident

- Accurately convey incident details to emergency response services & workplace supervisor as appropriate
- Maintain confidentiality of records and information in line with statutory and/or organisational policies

Evaluate the incident and own performance

- Recognise the possible psychological impacts on self and other rescuers involved in critical incidents
- Participate in debriefing to address individual needs
- Evaluate management of the incident
- Review contingency planning

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- Be at least 18 years of age. If under 18, parental consent is required prior to course commencement.

- Arrive in suitable clothing (long pants, closed-in shoes, long sleeve shirt)
- Be fit and able to squat and bend over
- Language, literacy and numeracy skills required to interpret legislative requirements and to undertake written and practical assessment activities

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MODE OF DELIVERY

Delivery of this course will be face to face; classroom-based blended with some practical activities. There are no pre-reading requirements. All content is covered in class as part of the training.

ASSESSMENT SUMMARY

THEORY The learner will be required to answer a number of written questions regarding their actions and theoretical application of knowledge.

Each student will be required to participate in practical scenarios to demonstrate that they have:

PRACTICAL

- managed, in line with ARC guidelines, the unconscious, breathing casualty including appropriate positioning to reduce the risk of airway compromise & managed the unconscious, non-breathing infant
- performing at least 2 minutes of uninterrupted single rescuer cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) on an adult manikin placed on the floor and using defibrillator (AED) to deliver at least one shock
- managed casualties, with anaphylaxis, asthma, non-life-threatening bleeding, choking, envenomation, using pressure immobilisation, fractures, dislocations, sprains and strains, using appropriate immobilisation techniques, minor wound cleaning and dressing, nosebleed, shock
- responded to at least two simulated first aid incidents, one medical and one trauma contextualised to the candidate's workplace or community setting
- coordinated a team of people to respond to a multiple casualty incident
